

TRENDY TRIMS

Go totally boho with a wall hanging made with dreamy, draping ribbons. Glue and tie three dowel rods together to make a triangle. Then wrap one end of each




Tobacco baskets are so in right now. Personalize yours with lamb's ear picks and cotton picks. Tie the faux botanicals in a bundle with wired ribbon (don't forget the bow) and secure it to the basket with wire. We added a wooden welcome sign, but it looks great without it too!



LETTER FIX

This DIY may seem like a toughy, but it's easy with a chicken wire wood frame (painted with pickling wash). Weave ribbon through the wire to form a vibrant background, glue on a painted letter, and you're done.



Center-of-attention lamps? Try this: With a pencil, mark the tops and bottoms of the lampshade where the ribbons will lay. Then mark the middle to ensure you keep things straight and even. Next, cut and tie your ribbons (using a reef knot) and glue or sew them onto the lampshade.

SEAT SWEET

Give that wooden stool a style upgrade by using braided rope to cover the seat. Attach the rope to the top by working in a spiral, starting in the middle and gluing as you go. Continue wrapping until the entire top is covered.



WINDOW VIEWS

For an easy way to jazz up a window, look to floral ribbon. Choose a spunky pattern and sew it to the curtains (starting about 5 ½ inches from the bottom). To finish, fold the ends over an inch and sew them down to secure.

BLOOM BABY

If you're new to DIYing with floral ribbons, stick to the basics. Flower arrangements look even better when their vases are wrapped in ribbon. Just tie a larger-than-life bow onto the front of the vase and you'll be decor-ready in minutes.

BEACHY KEEN

Get beach-ready in no time with a rope basket turned tote bag. Replace the handles with braided rope (about 36 inches per strap). Fancy up the bottom by gluing on layers of ribbon.
