ALL CHALK

The key to getting a bold art piece like this is with chalkboard paint and chalk markers. We painted our surface with chalkboard paint, and when it dried, we traced our design using chalk markers. Can you imagine the home decor possibilities?

WORK OF HEART

If the stencils you want to use (we chose a farmhouse stencil) are too small for the surface you want painted, scan them into a computer and transfer them to a digital projector using a USB flash drive. Then trace and paint away!



Art projectors are great tools for projecting images and turning them into designs for your larger-than-life artwork.



TO THE POINT

Hesitant to paint on your walls or furniture? Try canvases! They're smooth and easy to move around, making them perfect for tracing when working with art projectors. **Tip:** You can paint while the image is being projected or trace the image in pencil, then paint.



WITH LOVE

Planning an event or party? Use your art projector as a way to project slideshows or videos. To do this, you'll need a blank surface like a wall or foam board. Psst... Dress up your foam board a little by gluing it to a frame.



MARKS THE SPOT

New to the art of art projectors? Here's a tip: If you're right-handed, start your tracing from the left side and if you're left-handed, do the opposite. This reduces the chances of you accidentally smudging or smearing your design.



LEAF RELIEF

If the image you want to project could use a little altering, all you have to do is edit it when you're tracing. Removing details (like extra leaves or branches) from your image is easy—simply don't trace what you don't like.
