Accessory Hardware

WALLET WISHES

Want a wallet that's top of the line on the cheap? We've got you covered. Choose your fabric, find a closure that fits your needs (we used a press lock), and get started.

Tip: Turn it into a wristlet with a D ring and a swivel snap hook.

FINISHING CLUTCHES

We sewed a pocket insert separately so we could slide it into our wallet when we needed more pocket space.





SAY SEW

For a statement-making keychain, use bold fabric and ribbon. Layer and sew them together and use key fob hardware to keep everything in place. Psst... To personalize your keychain, add a tassel or a letter charm—or both!

CASE BY CASE

Keep your phone close (and protected) with a handmade phone wristlet. Sew a pouch and leave an opening in the side for a looped ribbon. This holds a D ring and a swivel snap hook for your wrist strap.

Tip: Use the width of your phone plus about $\frac{1}{2}$ " to measure your fabric.



MATCHING SET

With a few supplies like cotton webbing, fabric and hardware (like buckles and swivel snap hooks), you'll have a doggone cute collar in no time. And why not make a matching on-the-go wallet for yourself?





STAY IN CLUTCH

With Simplicity 2911, the hardest part about this project will be deciding what fabric to use. When you're finished, use fabric scraps and a swivel snap hook to make an embellishment for your wallet.

BADGE OF HONOR

Can't find a pattern for a badge holder? Look to Simplicity 2274. This pattern is for a luggage tag, but instead of using an eyelet, secure a suspender clip to the top.



BUCKLE UP

The trick to getting that bit of sparkle on a keychain like this is to use a rhinestone buckle. It's small and perfect for sliding over a ribbon before you sew the ribbon to your fabric.

WALK IN THE PARK

By adding a parachute buckle to this lanyard, you make your keys easy-to-grab in seconds. Just choose your fabric, pick up hardware like buckles and swivel snap hooks and you're ready to create. **Tip:** *Just for fun, we made a matching dog collar with the extra fabric.*





IN THE BAG

Makeup can be fun, but it's not half as fun as making the bag it's kept in. We got this pleated look by folding the outer fabric in toward the middle of the bag and sewing it in place. **Tip:** For help sewing a zipper, check out our tutorial on YouTube.



LANYARD LOVE

We made this badge holder with the same pattern as the last badge DIY. We added a 1-inch section of fabric at the top, and instead of eyelets we used snaps. Then you can attach your holder to a DIY'd lanyard using a D ring. Psst... Use clear vinyl for a window.



KEY FOBS

Pieces like rings and clamps come in a key fob hardware set, making it easy to attach keys, charms or anything else you need.



SNAP HOOKS

Whatever your style, you can find a snap hook to match it. They clasp and stay closed, so they're perfect for attaching your keys and other go-to items. This one is antique gold, but you can find them in silver too.

SNAP FASTENERS

Snap fasteners like this are ideal for getting a secure hold on your DIY. They have a strong hold, and they're small and subtle so you'll barely notice them. Here, they're used to hold an ID badge to a lanyard.



PARACHUTE BUCKLES

Parachute buckles are a must-have for projects like collars or lanyards. They're sturdy and will keep things firmly in place.





SWIVEL SNAP HOOKS, D RINGS & SLIDE BUCKLES

Hardware like swivel snap hooks and D rings are ideal for attaching wristlets or tassels to bags and wallets. **Tip:** For a larger ring to work with, swap out a D ring for a slide buckle.

SEW WHAT

Are your go-to items always at the bottom of your purse? DIY a keychain pouch so you can reach all your faves in an instant. For a closure, sew a loop of trim into the top of the pouch and sew a button into the pouch itself. **Tip:** The hardware used here comes in a key fob set.
